SCOPE OF THIS ADDENDUM

The following becomes a part of the original project manual and drawings, taking precedence over the items that may conflict. The bidder shall note receipt and make acknowledgment of the Addendum on his/her bid form, incorporating its provision in his/her bid.

PROJECT MANUAL

The following additions, changes and clarifications have been made to the Project Manual.

In Section 00200 - Instruction to Bidder (Article 4, paragraph 4.07.F) and several other sections of the Technical Specifications dealing with imported materials (sand, gravel, granular bedding, select gravel, crushed base, imported fill, rip rap or other quarried or mined materials, etc.) the following statement is included:

- “F. For both new borrow sites and existing pit or commercial sources, proof of State Historical Preservation Officer (SHPO) clearance must be obtained before material can be brought onto the project site. The proof of clearance (the SHPO letter) and a copy of the archaeologist’s technical report of the pedestrian survey, including maps, must be submitted to Reclamation’s archaeologist prior to the start of construction utilizing the subject imported materials. Reclamation’s project manager will acknowledge that the clearance meets all requirements and that construction utilizing the subject imported materials can proceed to Owner. No work utilizing the subject imported materials can begin until this step is completed.

New Borrow Sites. Perform investigations to secure off-project site materials (if required) such as borrow areas for sand, gravel, granular bedding, select gravel, crushed base, imported fill, rip rap or



other quarried or mined materials, etc., and Bidder is solely responsible for securing site access to potential sources to conduct such explorations and tests as Bidder deems necessary for submission of a Bid. Potential borrow areas will need to meet the Borrow Area Cultural Resources Inventory in accordance with Clause 8.0 (e.) of Section 00820 – Bureau of Reclamation Supplemental Provisions and Paragraph 3.1.D of Section 01100 – Environmental Quality Protection.

Existing Pit or Commercial Source. Imported materials (sand, gravel, granular bedding, select gravel, crushed base, imported fill, rip rap or other quarried or mined materials, etc.) from an existing operation or commercial source must come from a source previously surveyed by a professional archaeologist and cleared by the SHPO. Proof of clearance means a letter from the SHPO that concurs with a determination of “no historic properties affected” or “no adverse effect to historic properties”. It shall be the Bidder’s responsibility to verify the material source supplier’s ability to provide the necessary proof of clearance documentation as required. Proof of SHPO clearance must be obtained before subject imported material can be brought onto the project site. Refer to Clause 8.0 (e.) of Section 00820 – Bureau of Reclamation Supplemental Provisions and Paragraph 3.4.D of Section 01100 – Environmental Quality Protection;”

The following clarification was issued by the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation on August 17, 2018:

Based on the standard operating procedures of the Iowa State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) (personal communication with Steve King, August 17, 2018), contractors may use materials from existing commercial pits on the Lewis & Clark Regional Water Supply projects in Iowa. Reclamation will follow these same procedures in Iowa and the contractor does not need to provide a Section 106 clearance letter from the SHPO when using commercial pits. However, Reclamation must have a list of any and all pits intended for use during construction prior to the start of any work in Iowa.

If the contractor selects a previously undisturbed area for borrow or fill on projects in Iowa, Reclamation requires a cultural resource survey by a professional archaeologist, Section 106 consultation with the SHPO, and a clearance letter from the SHPO prior to the start of work in Iowa.

If Bidder elects to use imported materials from an existing pit or commercial source outside of Iowa, the above clauses remain in effect. If Bidder elects to open a new borrow pit, regardless of state, the above clauses remain in effect.
